





TransLink delivers an integrated, regional transit and transportation system to over 2.4 million people




Today, more than ever, transit keeps our region moving







PARTNER: to improve coordination between land use, development, and transit through better guidelines




-  **Destinations:** Locate along the way
-  **Distance:** Create a well-coordinated street network
-  **Design:** Design places for people
-  **Density:** Concentrate activities near frequent transit
-  **Diversity:** Encourage a mix of uses
-  **Demand Management:** Discourage unnecessary driving

PARTNER: to coordinate growth and development along important transit corridors



The **Frequent Transit Network** are corridors where transit service runs at least every 15 minutes in both directions throughout the day and into the evening, every day of the week.



Continue to focus investments along today and tomorrow's key transit corridors and networks

-  **FTN** Stops on these streets have combined Regular Bus services at FTN levels as described above
-  **B-Line** Frequent bus service, with limited stops.
-  **Canada Line** High frequency rail service. Early morning to late evening.
-  **Expo Line** High frequency rail service. Early morning to late evening.
-  **Millennium Line** High frequency rail service. Early morning to late evening.
-  **SeaBus** Frequent passenger ferry service. Early morning to late evening.


